











2019 JACKRABBIT SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

May 18-19, 2019

1. Rules

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.

2. Notices to Competitors

Notices to Competitors will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board located at the waterfront pavilion.

3. Changes to Sailing Instructions

Changes to the sailing instructions will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board before 0900 on May 18 and 0800 on May 19 except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect. There may also be changes subsequent to a Skipper's Meeting. Such changes will be posted within 10 minutes of the conclusion of the Skipper's Meeting. (Changes RRS 90.2.c)

4. Signals Made Ashore

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the dock-side flagstaff located near the rest rooms. When the flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 25 minutes' in the race signal AP.

5. Schedule of Races

Six races are planned, with additional races at the discretion of the Race Committee.

A Skipper's Meeting will be held on May 20 at 0930 hours at the waterfront stairs.

5.3 Saturday, May 18 The Warning signal for the first race of the day will at **1025** hours. No start will be made after **1600** hours on Saturday.

Sunday, May 19 The Warning signal for the first race of the day will at **0855** hours. No start will be made after **1200** hours on Sunday

6. Class Flag

The Class Flag will be a J/22 flag.

7. Racing Area

The racing area will be on Canandaigua Lake in the area near CYC.

8. The Courses

Courses will be windward/leeward as shown in section 18.

A leeward gate, with marks set no less than 6 boat lengths apart, may be used without signal. When a gate is set, boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark. Adjustment of the gate during the race shall not be considered a change of course. A leeward gate shall not be a mark of the course on a downwind finish. Diagrams of the Courses and Gates are found in section 18.

9. Marks

Marks will be large tetrahedrons, with the exception of the Offset Mark that will be a yellow ball.

10. Special Obstruction

A non-racing vessel whose occupants are actively engaged in the sport of fishing is deemed an *obstruction*. Racing boats shall maintain a minimum separation of 50 feet in all directions of a fishing vessel.

11. The Start

1

- **11.1** The starting line will be between an Orange staff on the RC Signal vessel at the starboard end and the port end starting mark.
- **11.2** A boat starting 10 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5..

12. The Finish

The finish line will be between an **Orange** staff on an RC vessel and the nearest mark.

13. Time Limit

Time limit for the first boat to round the first mark is 30 minutes. Time limit for the first boat to finish is 90 minutes. Any boats finishing more than 30 minutes after the first boat will be scored TLE and will be scored one place greater than the last boat to finish within the time limit. This changes RRS A11 and RRS35, A4, A5.

14. Protests:

The Protest Time limit shall be 30 minutes following the arrival of the Race Committee Signal vessel at the dock following the last race of each day. Protest forms are available at the RC signal vessel. Protest Arbitration - Appendix T shall be in effect.

15. Scoring

- 15.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- **15.2** (a) When fewer than six races have been completed a boat's series score will be the total of all her race scores.
 - (b) When six or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of all her race scores excluding her worst score. This changes RRS A2.

16. Safety Regulations

- **16.1** A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.
- **16.2** Prior to the first start of each morning sequence, all boats shall sail on starboard past the transom of the RC Signal vessel to check in. The penalty for failure to check in will be 4 places, if protested.

17. Communications

The Race Committee intends to communicate with competitors via marine VHF radio on channel 9 (nine). Race Committee may broadcast its intentions, count-down to start, OCS, etc. as a courtesy. Receiving radio communications from the RC shall not be a violation of RRS 41. If a boat is in breach of RRS 29.1 or 30.1, the RC will attempt to notify her sail number by hailing and by VHF radio. Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. (This changes rule L 27). Failure of the Race Committee to make a broadcast or failure of a boat to hear a broadcast shall not be grounds for redress.

18. Course Diagrams
